HELPS DONATION RECIPIENT: NATIONAL FALLEN FIREFIGHTER FOUNDATION

In the United States, there are over one million career and volunteer firefighters responding in times of distress. These individuals are trained to answer fire alarms, medical emergencies, hazardous materials, urban rescue, and other calls in the pursuit of protecting life and property. Conditions are often dangerous or risky. They can lead to injury and in worse cases, death.

NOVEC HELPS aided in these various efforts by sponsoring breakfast during the regional golf tournament in June. The total amount donated was \$1,500.

Since 1992, the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation has led a nationwide effort to honor fallen heroes so that their sacrifice is never forgotten. The foundation provides programs for families and departments of fallen firefighters.

This foundation has led an effort in honoring America's fallen firefighters. This effort is enacted by providing assistance and support programs to the families and departments of fallen heroes in rebuilding their lives. Additionally, the foundation awards scholarship assistance to spouses, life partners, children, and stepchildren of fallen firefighters for education and job training costs.

Furthermore, the foundation works to prevent line-of-duty deaths and injuries. In 2004, the foundation launched the Everyone Goes Home program, which provides free training, resources, and programs for implementation of the 16 Firefighter Life

Safety Initiatives.
