SPOTLIGHT ON HELPS **DONATION RECIPIENT:** HOUSE OF MERCY

On Feb. 28, House of Mercy invited NOVEC HELPS members for a tour of its Manassas facilities to gain insight into its programs. Founded in 2005, House of Mercy is a nonprofit organization addressing poverty in the Prince William community. Services provided include a food pantry, adult education, a community thrift store, and resources for other essentials.

Through the efforts of over 500 volunteers, House of Mercy assisted more than 50,000 people with food insecurity in 2023. That number is expected to grow this year as the community's needs grow. This assistance is made possible by the support of donors throughout the community, including NOVEC HELPS. NOVEC HELPS has donated \$1,500 to House of Mercy.

During the tour, House of Mercy Outreach Coordinator Rebecca Wire led NOVEC HELPS members Nan Musick, Duane Royal, Rhy Wiethe, Brigette Adkins, and Jenny Shaskan through the organization's three key areas. Starting in the food donation center, Wire informed the group about soaring demand, the need for expanding storage space, and the distribution process. Clients can "shop" for groceries from the donated items according to their family's needs.

Then Wire escorted the group to the donation center for the thrift store located at 8170 Flannery Ct. in Manassas. From clothing to furniture to household items, the warehouse was filled with items currently being sorted on their way to the store floor.

The tour concluded in the thrift store. House of Mercy clients may shop at the thrift store free of charge and members of the community are welcome to purchase items as well. All proceeds go to House of Mercy. An altar sits in the back where they hold Catholic Mass weekly, but also where many visit for personal moments of reflection, peace, and enlightenment.

Customer Care Manager and NOVEC HELPS member Duane Royal reflected on the visit, stating "It is a great feeling to be able to give back to the community that you serve," he said. "During our tour of the House of Mercy, we were able to see how they provide emotionally, spiritually, and physically to the needs of their clients, our neighbors."

NOVEC AND NOVEC HELPS DONATE TO MEDSTAR WASHINGTON MEDICAL BURN CENTER

In recognition of Burn Awareness Week, observed in February, NOVEC and NOVEC HELPS teamed up to donate \$2,000 to MedStar Washington Hospital Center's Burn Center. MedStar is the only adult burn treatment center in the Washington Metropolitan area, serving the District of Columbia, southern Maryland, Northern Virginia, and eastern West Virginia.

The NOVEC and NOVEC HELPS contributions of \$1,000 apiece will go toward construction currently underway at the MedStar Burn Center, which includes renovations in the hospital's Burn Intensive Care Unit.

"We hope that our employees will never have to use the burn center but, if any of NOVEC's lineworkers are hurt in an electrical accident, this is where they would go for help," explained NOVEC's Manager of Risk Management, Safety, and Security Shawn Davis.
