NOVEC HELPS DONATES TO NORTHERN VIRGINIA FOOD RESCUE

In October, 2022 NOVEC HELPS donated \$1,000 to Northern Virginia Food Rescue for the "Hunger is Scary" fundraiser held at the rescue's headquarters in Manassas. This event is specifically timed around Halloween in preparation for the holiday season, which can be the most challenging time for those in need to put food on their tables.

Founded in 2020, Northern Virginia Food Rescue provides food for the hungry in our area by working with restaurants and grocery stores to pick up unused food and deliver it to people in need. Additionally, the nonprofit collects backpacks filled with easy-to-prepare foods for families, and they distributes boxes of food from the Capital Area Food Bank.

"This event was not only fun, but brought together so many people within the community," said NOVEC HELPS Treasurer Kim Love. "It was great to see so many people come out to support such a worthy cause."
