SPOTLIGHT ON SERVICE: HISTORIC PRINCE WILLIAM

Spotlight on Service gives you a chance to learn more about organizations that NOVEC HELPS has been supporting. In this feature, we take a closer look at Historic Prince William.

Founded in 1988, Historic Prince William is a nonprofit organization dedicated to working with historic groups in the area to preserve and protect county resources, disseminating historical information, and broadening the base of public interest in local history. It achieves this by sponsoring tours, speaking in schools, supporting research, and printing material of historic interest.

A pivotal role Historic Prince William plays in the community is maintaining and restoring cemeteries in need of attention. These sites often consist of overgrown landscapes, damaged or weathered headstones, and, sometimes, unidentifiable grave markers. Historic Prince William volunteers identify these sites and donate their time and materials to clean up the surrounding areas, and repairing the headstones. Reclaiming these sites involves: establishing a perimeter, removing debris, weed whacking the area to locate the headstones, and repair them with masonry epoxy.

[SPARC \(Specially Adapted Resources Clubs\)](#) is an organization founded in 2006 that provides day programs for adults with disabilities. Across their five locations throughout Northern Virginia, SPARC offers a supportive structure through continued education, leisure learning activities, and socialization opportunities to appeal to each individual’s interests.

The “Bubbles and Bling” Gala, held in Loudoun County on May 4, raised funds to keep these daily programs running. The event consisted of a cocktail reception, live auction, dinner, and speeches from several representatives. The evening generated over \$41,000 for SPARC programs.

“Hearing young adults discuss their daily hardships gave me perspective on things I may take for granted,” said Kim Case-Timberlake, one of the NOVEC HELPS representatives at the event. “We may not always see the benefits of our donations, but events like these showcase the difference we and other sponsors are making in the lives of those who need it. That is why we do what we do.”

NOVEC HELPS PET FOOD DRIVE FOR FAUQUIER FISH

With help and generosity from NOVEC employees, NOVEC HELPS was able to donate over 270 pounds of pet food to Fauquier FISH in April.

[FISH \(For Immediate Sympathetic Help\)](#) is a nonprofit organization that has been providing food to the community since 1983. Through their food pantry, FISH packages DASH (Delicious, Affordable, Simple, and Healthy) meals that provide economically disadvantaged people with nutritionally rich food.

The recent pet food drive assisted FISH clients who were sacrificing their own nutrition by sharing their meals with their pets. By distributing pet food, individuals no longer need to make that sacrifice, and both populations feel nourished and cared for.
